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BREAKOUT SESSION DESCRIPTIONS:

STRAND 1

Advancing Collaborative Structures

Aligning Teacher and Leader Learning

Driving key instructional initiatives through clusters is critical to the instructional leadership team's (ILT) work. Join this session to explore the connection between the ILT's work and cluster learning to maximize the impact on student success.

Assessing the Impact of Professional Learning

Cluster meetings are successful when the new learning positively affects student learning when implemented in the classroom. Participants in this session will explore how an effective instructional leadership team consistently measures the impact of cluster meetings to ensure success.

Turning School Plans into Actions

Translating school plans into actionable steps is crucial for effective school improvement. This session focuses on coaching leadership team members to develop and implement daily actions that align with school goals, ensuring these actions drive meaningful progress and success.

Using Data to Empower Teacher Support

Ongoing student assessment data drives specific instructional preparation practices and student progress throughout the school year. Explore how leadership teams can use assessment data to guide teachers through effective instructional preparation, helping to refine practices and maximize impact on student success.

Individualized Coaching and Support

Intentional Instructional Reflection for Impact

Intentional instructional reflection demonstrates growth for teachers and students, as supported by the instructional leadership team (ILT). Participants in this session will explore ways the ILT effectively monitors and supports growth through instructional reflection.

Maximizing the Impact of Coaching

As instructional coaches, we must continue learning, growing, and improving our practices to maximize our impact. In this session, participants will reflect on how they measure the impact of their coaching and support to refine practice and increase effectiveness.

Evidence-based Coaching Conversations

Effective coaching uses data to guide reflective practice and shared decision-making. Participants in this session will learn how to incorporate student performance data, observational data, and other evidence sources into coaching conversations to drive focused instructional improvement through collaboration.

Collaborative Coaching for Aligned Support

Coaching and support can come from various members of the instructional leadership team over time, but for this work to have the greatest impact, it must be aligned with school goals and student needs. Participants in this session will explore strategies for ensuring continuous, aligned support and collaborating to maximize impact on both teacher growth and student achievement.

Maximizing Instructional Coherence

Tailoring Grouping to Student Needs

Effective grouping structures are crucial for addressing diverse student needs and enhancing learning outcomes. This session aims to provide educators with the tools to identify, implement, and support appropriate grouping strategies based on student work and progress.

Effectively Supporting the Science of Reading

Evidence-based practices for teaching literacy are essential to improve student outcomes and long-term literacy success. Join this session to develop the ability to provide targeted feedback to teachers, ensuring literacy instruction is rooted in research-based practices.

Supporting High Levels of Discourse

Effective classroom discourse is essential for deepening student understanding and promoting critical thinking. This session will explore how to recognize high levels of academic discourse, assess current discourse practices, and provide actionable strategies for supporting teachers in enhancing their discourse techniques.

Creating Systems for Success

Instructional coherence is essential for ensuring that all aspects of a school's operation align effectively to support student learning and success. This session will guide school and district leaders in designing and implementing a data-driven decision-making system that aligns leadership structures and practices with the specific needs of their teachers and students.

Optimizing the Learning Environment

Empowering Student Ownership Through Teacher Leadership

Join this session to explore methods for helping teachers continuously assess and adapt instructional practices to empower students to take charge of their learning journey.

Bubble Sessions

Bubble sessions allow educators to observe a collaborative learning opportunity modeled by school and district leaders and facilitated by NIET leaders. In these sessions, educators are seated around a center table where the meeting will occur, with participants surrounding them in a "bubble" to observe. Throughout the meeting, there will be "stepouts" where participants will reflect on what they are observing, and facilitators will unpack what they are learning. These sessions will each highlight a different collaborative learning opportunity: cluster/PLC meeting. instructional leadership team (ILT) meeting, and district instructional leadership team (D-ILT) meeting.

Participants will:

- » Identify key elements of high-quality cluster/PLC, ILT, or D-ILT meetings that build educator capacity to improve instructional practice.
- » Analyze how cluster/PLC, ILT, or D-ILT meeting structures can accelerate educator impact.
- » Determine the next steps for creating or strengthening cluster/PLC, ILT, or D-ILT meeting structures in their district or school.

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
